LAWA & SoFi FAIR HELPS JOB SEEKERS GET BACK IN THE GAME

Nearly 3,000 job seekers attended the Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA) and SoFi hiring fair last week at SoFi Stadium, which offered more than 5,000 job openings provided by more than 45 employers. The job openings included opportunities in the airline industry, food services and hospitality.

Representatives from EWDD's Rapid Response Team and WorkSource Centers were on-site to aid Angelenos impacted by COVID-related job loss, by introducing them to job training services available at the City's 16 WorkSource Centers. It was the largest job fair involving EWDD's Rapid Response Team in 20 years, since a hiring event held shortly after the September 11 terrorist attacks, according to staff.

EWDD's role at the hiring fair was to inform and register as many Angelenos as possible for the free job services available at the City's WorkSource Centers, including paid short-term vocational training, on-the-job training and direct job placement. Apart from job training, EWDD was also granted special funding to assist participants who lost their jobs during COVID-19 and needed support covering the cost of utilities or other expenses.

The employment and support services offered through the WorkSource Centers have helped many Angelenos re-enter the workforce, including Jean, who was laid off from her job at Qatar Airways due to COVID-19. The Safer at Home orders and travel restrictions during COVID-19 decimated the tourism industry, resulting in the mass lay-off of employees who worked in the airline industry or airline related industries. After Jean lost her job, she connected with the Pico-Union/Downtown WorkSource Center, operated by EWDD partner Pacific Asian Consortium in Employment (PACE). The center helped Jean enroll in job training that will help her transition into a new career in human resources. Jean began her training at California State University, Dominguez Hills (CSUDH) in June 2021.



EWDD BusinessSource Centers HOLLYWOOD BSC HELPS DRIVE LAUNCH OF TRANSPORT COMPANY

Since January 2020, the Hollywood BusinessSource Center (BSC) has offered continuous assistance to Zorel Ramirez Ortiz, owner of Zoreif Transport.

Zorel (above) first connected with the Hollywood BSC for assistance on a loan application, which she paused due to the COVID-19 outbreak. In July 2021, Zorel reached back out to a Hollywood BSC business consultant for help launching her business, Zoreif Transport. After an initial assessment, the consultant provided Zorel guidance on cash flow management, preparing projections, along with a profitability analysis.

In August 2021, the Hollywood BSC assisted Zorel in preparing a loan application for start-up capital for the business, including assembling required documentation and fees to purchase three delivery trucks. The BSC worked closely with Zorel during the loan packaging process, including an owner's injection review, projection edit and an access to capital consultation. These services were not only important for the loan application, but also helped Zorel gain a better understanding of entrepreneurship and how to build a successful business. The loan was approved later that month and paves the way to generate two new full-time jobs. The Hollywood BSC is overseen by EWDD partner Managed Career Solutions (MCS).
